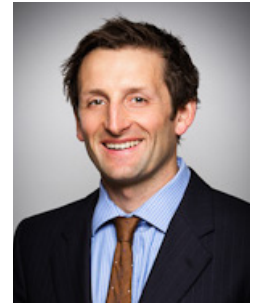

### Introduction
